

Who we are:

The Washington State Association of Head Start & ECEAP (WSA) Parent Ambassadors is a grassroots organizing program for low income parents involved with Head Start and ECEAP in Washington. The program is based on an empowerment model of peer-to-peer training and education. Parent Ambassadors assist our association's efforts to advocate for increased investments in Head Start and ECEAP and related children's programs and are part of a sustainable cadre of parent advocates who can continue to fight for positive social change.

Twenty Parent Ambassadors from across Washington
State are accepted each year, receive training on legislative advocacy and grassroots organizing, and are responsible for training parents in their local programs and participating in organizing WSA advocacy campaigns.

Accomplishments:

Since 2008 Parent Ambassadors have achieved considerable success in their advocacy for state and federal legislation and child-friendly budgets. Parent Ambassadors helped to pass legislation mandating that the state serve all eligible children in ECEAP by 2018. They also played a key role in pushing through a Child Welfare bill. They have been active at the federal level advocating for Head Start, child care, and other early learning programs. In this past legislative session Parent Ambassadors contributed to the following early learning victories:



- Parent Ambassadors advocated for the Child Welfare bill, which led to making those children in the child welfare system gain priority for entering ECEAP.
- Drayton Jackson, 2014 Parent Ambassador has started his own non-profit organization called "Parents in Politics". Through is organization he will be working with local school districts and parent groups on the power of parents voting.
- Grace Ssebugwawo, 2014 Parent Ambassador from Federal Way also started her own non-profit organization called Culture Legacy Outreach International. Culture Legacy Outreach International will bridge the gaps within the education system by integrating culture experience interventions to address education disparities. It will reinforce education instruction through relevant practice and modeling.
